

SLADE Curriculum Policy

The Department of English in the School of Liberal Arts (SLADE) offers a rigorous academic program carefully designed to prepare students to have a broad knowledge of liberal arts, and to think critically and creatively, and to equip them to contribute to a globalized society with highly developed English language abilities. In order to implement this educational philosophy, the English Department will organize the curriculum based on the following policies:

1. In order to acquire extensive and versatile basic knowledge as well as obtaining basic academic skills, the General Courses will consist of courses related to health, courses related to languages and information literacy, courses related to domestic and overseas societies, cultures and histories.
2. In order to acquire specialized knowledge and methods in an organized way, the following areas of courses will be offered.
 - 1) Courses in the field of English Communication to nourish the basic English skills
 - 2) Courses in the field of International and Areal Studies to obtain better international and cross-cultural understanding
 - 3) Courses in the field of Business Communication to establish the foundation necessary for career pursuit
 - 4) Courses in the field of Literature, Linguistics, and Education for nourish better understanding of human nature
 - 5) Seminar courses and Graduation Research for obtaining abilities to solve problems and create new values by utilizing acquired knowledge and skills
